### Zoho Documents

<https://www.zoho.com/docs/>

Zoho Docs gets you started with 5 GB for free to store and retrieve all your files. You can sync files and folders on your desktop and work in them from any device. Zoho gives you online file storage, folder and bulk upload, an email-in feature which lets you email files to your account, a document conversion feature, a PDF viewer, and a full-text search feature. Users who want to more storage and unlimited sharing can sign up for a \$5 a month program to have 50GB storage.

### Microsoft Word Online

Open and edit Word, Excel, and PowerPoint files with anyone, virtually anywhere, in real time – for free with your Microsoft account. You can create, store, and share documents, spreadsheets, presentations, and notebooks online.

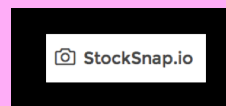

With Blendspace, you can create lessons with digital content in just a few minutes. You fill in the “boxes” on your lesson with YouTube videos, Google content, Flickr photographs, web page links, and/or your own media or files. You can also insert quizzes in the lesson and Blendspace will keep track of your students’ responses. You can share your lessons on Google Classroom, facebook, on the web, or via Twitter.

Another feature of Blendspace is that you can access free (or paid) lessons already created by teachers around the world.

In just a few minutes, I was able to put together a lesson about cells, using resources from Infotopia. However, I also searched for “cells” as a topic and found over 20 completed lessons by other teachers in the gallery at Blendspace.
